NEW DAIRY PRINCESS CROWNED Eden Baldridge of Orland Selected as District 3 Dairy Ambassador

She is a member of the Orland High School cheer team and shows hogs through Future Farmers of America. After graduation, Mackenzie would like to pursue a degree in Agriculture.

Mackenzie will assist Eden in her duties as Dairy Princess, which include speaking on behalf of the California dairy industry to various audiences throughout the year. As Dairy Princess and Alternate, Eden and Mackenzie will attend a professional development training focused on presentation skills, advocating for the California dairy industry, leadership, and business etiquette.

Candidates were judged on speaking ability, education, dairy background, poise, and personality. Judges for the contest were Katie Boles, Lisa Humphreys, and Jennifer Beretta.
